The 2014 Adequan/FEI North American Junior & Young Rider Championships (NAJYRC, for short) start this week in Lexington Kentucky! With a CCI** (Young Riders) and a CCI* (juniors) competition, the NAJYRC has long been a stepping stone to national equestrian teams for eventers. Held this year at the storied Kentucky Horse Park, young riders gather from across the United States, Canada, Mexico, the Dominican Republic, and elsewhere to compete in show jumping, dressage, endurance, and eventing.

Our own Area II team has been hard at work and are ready to rock this year's competition! Proactive fundraising as well as diligent training at preparatory events and Training Camp has allowed the team to head to Kentucky with a strong squad, coached by Sinead Halpin, newly named to the U.S. squad for the World Equestrian Games.

Area II is also sending grooms who will be front and center for the excitement of NAJYRC.

Grooms are not only introduced to the riders' preparation and

training, they will learn worldclass horse management practices from our very own Meg Kepferle and Area II team veterinarian Dr. Susan Johns. If you're thinking of competing at NAJYRC in the next few years, being a groom is a great way to see what the Championships are all about.

MORVEN PARK EXPANDS EQUESTRIAN FACILITIES

Historic Morven Park plans to break ground this fall on new equestrian facilities. Included in their plans are four new competition arenas with updated footing and facilities, as well as a viewing pavilion for spectators and hospitality. Additional improvements will include a Grand Prix field, all new barns, and a new indoor stadium.

Today, Morven Park's
Equestrian Center hosts about 30
events each year, including
Morven Park's Spring and Fall
Horse Trials (which draw eventers
ranging from beginner to
Olympic-level), dressage shows,

driving competitions, Pony Club rallies and camps, hunter shows, and educational clinics. Morven has also hosted the Area II Championships, and in the past has held a CCI* competition.

Morven Park is operated by the Westmoreland Davis Memorial Foundation. The nonprofit organization was established to preserve and promote the historic site in memory of its final owner, Westmoreland Davis, who served as Virginia governor from 1918 to 1922. The existing equestrian facilities were originally built in the late 1960s. Morven Park
Development Director Suzanne
Musgrave notes that updating the park's offering will allow
Morven to offer "an exceptional competition venue with ample warm-up space, airy barns, and safe and efficient traffic flow for horses, spectators and vehicles."
